SEND Reform Update at EPC's Annual General Meeting

Parents, young people, and partners had the opportunity to listen to the presentation by Janet Leach, OBE on the SEND Reform Implementation in Enfield during Every Parent & Child's AGM on 13th July. Janet talked of the achievements of the local area and how together with different partners, we are addressing the needs of families of children with Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND). Parents also asked questions and raised some issues faced by families including health and housing. As a result, it has been agreed to hold another event with parents and different services so that issues can be addressed.

EPC also presented certificates to our volunteers to recognise their contribution to EPC's work. The awarding of certificates was done by Enfield Mayor, Christine Hamilton and Jaspal Dhani, EPC's Chief Executive.

Mike and Alain, members of the SENDIASS Young People's steering group talked about their participation in the group and encouraged other young people to become members. They said that the training they have received has increased their confidence and that they can now present in front of a big audience.



EPC wins contract

EPC has been awarded the contract to continue providing the Special Educational Needs and Disability Information, Advice and Support Service (SENDIASS) after its successful bid in July 2017.

However, with the reduced funding, we are now implementing a new way of working to meet the demand for the service.

We are focusing in enabling families to deal with issues through training and information sessions. We will be training more volunteers to help us in events and managing the helpline.

We continue to encourage the participation of parents and young people and maintain our parents' and young people's steering groups. We are also recruiting volunteer interpreters to support parents from Enfield's diverse community.

Young people and their parents had an informative and fun time at the Summer Fest on Friday 21st July. They learned about independent living, careers pathways, emotional wellbeing, and physical health from the presentation of partners from the Local Authority, voluntary sector groups, and NHS.

Haringey Shed led interactive activities where young people sang and played games. No participant left empty-handed as everyone won prizes in the raffle draw. All prizes were donations from different local businesses and elsewhere in London. Some donors also provided cakes, sandwiches, and pizzas.

All young people had their souvenir photos taken in a photo booth with a summery background, and had fun playing quizzes and games. Three young people celebrating their birthdays in July and August also had their cakes from Free Cakes for Kids Enfield who have always supported our past events.

The Summer Fest was aimed at giving the young people the opportunity to listen to relevant topics and ask questions. It was also an opportunity for them to meet other young people and establish contacts and possible friendship with each other.
