If your child's attendance drops below 90% this triggers a cause for concern and could lead to a penalty notice or prosecution. Please note that in the future, Chesterfield will be making more use of Fixed Penalty Notices for unauthorised absences.

MEASLES in Enfield

Public Health have notified school that there have been cases of measles in the area. This is a highly infectious disease, and can lead to severe complications. Symptoms to look for include- high fever; sore, red, watery eyes; coughing; aching and feeling generally unwell; and a blotchy red-brown rash, which usually appears after the first symptoms

The advice is

- If you suspect your child (or you) has measles contact your GP by phone or email, and tell them you suspect measles
- Stay away from school for at least four (4) days from when the rash started, and stay away from vulnerable people or children under one years old.
- Make sure that all children are up-to-date with their MMR vaccination. If you have any children of school age who have not yet had two doses of MMR, please go to your GP or practice nurse to get vaccinations up to date.
